

- ✓ Identify the personal protective equipment you'll use on the job site and how to use it effectively.
- ✓ Know the precautions to take when working with workplace chemicals, including understanding the Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) and safety data sheets.
- ✓ Understand the importance of protecting the environment around your work site, and how to make that happen.
- ✓ Recognize the different types of hazards you may encounter on a job site, and how to assess and control them.
- ✓ Identify the tools, equipment, and vehicles you'll use on site, and how to use them safely.
- Know precautions to take when working at heights, excavating and trenching, and working near power lines.
